### Extended Abstract

From the first-year through the senior year, BSM students are required to compile an electronic career portfolio (ECP) of their work in consultation with their academic adviser. The ECP should be a representative sampling of the student's best work and conform to the Management Electronic Career Portfolio Requirement Guidelines. Such a portfolio allows the Management department faculty to judge students' abilities to express themselves and their knowledge through their graphic and written work. Since 2007 we have been struggling with helping students develop professional looking electronic portfolios. Over the years we switched from static build web sites, to LinkedIn, and now we are using Wordpress.org. Student EP's look much more professional since we made this switch and this presenter wanted to investigate student satisfaction and motivation levels. The presenter's goal was to determine motivation levels regarding student satisfaction in creating an EP using WordPress.org. In addition, the presenter wanted to determine the base skills that were used during development and if any new skills were learned while creating the EP. Finally, the presenter also wanted to determine if students were able to see their own self improvement and growth spanning from freshman to senior year while developing a holistic snap-shot of their college career.
